Did you know....On March 13, 2023, Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker signed the Paid Leave for All Workers Act (PLAWA) into law, guaranteeing all workers in the state of Illinois 40 hours of paid time off each year for any reason. The law goes into effect on January 1, 2024, so employers need to use the remaining months of 2023 to ensure they are prepared for compliance with the new law.

Illinois is now the third state to enact such a law, following Maine and Nevada.

#### Don't forget...... Commercial Property Enhancement Grant

Businesses located in the Godfrey Business District are eligible to take advantage of the "Commercial Property Enhancement Grant" program.

**Funding:** First \$5,000 — maximum grant is 50%; and, \$5,001 and above is 25% of eligible expenses. The grant limit is a maximum of \$20,000 per project.

**Eligible Expenses:** Significant facade renovations, signage, awnings, doors, windows. Landscaping if it follows Godfrey Ordinance No. 15-2007. Parking lots if brought up to ADA compliance and Village codes. All appropriate permits must be secured.

Ineligible Expenses: Regular repairs and maintenance, demolition, design, permit fees; and expenses incurred or contracted prior to grant approval.

Eligibility Criteria and Conditions: Owners and tenants of properties within Godfrey's Business District (at time of application). The property's primary use must be for commercial use. Tenants must provide written authorization from the property owner for the contemplated improvements and participation in the program. If the tenant or owner who receives grant funding should close, move, or remove work financed with a grant within five years of grant date, repayment of the grant may be required, pro rata for a period of the remaining three-year term. No additional grant funds are available for similar work at same space for a period of at least three years. Application for the grant does require three bids. The grant must be approved prior to commencement of work.

#### Featured Business of the Month: Joe's Market Basket—Godfrey



Spring has sprung. Grass is turning green, flowers will be blooming and gardens will be planted. As days warm and lengthen, outdoor living begins to take place. Joe's Market Basket in Godfrey stands ready to help get ready for spring and summer.

Before getting into the products and service provided at the Godfrey location, a bit of history of the overall company. In 1971, Joe and Linda Stevens started Market Basket by draining Linda's savings account, all \$411. Joe sold produce out of the back of a pickup truck in the location of the current Edwardsville store Together they built the business into a successful landscape, garden and grocery store, now with five locations: Edwardsville, O'Fallon, Godfrey, Troy and St. Peters, Missouri.

Joe and Linda are fully retired and have turned over operations to their three sons. Jason has been working full time at The Market Basket since graduating from high school. He oversees the landscape and garden center for the business. Clay joined the business after college in 1996 and manages the grocery and oversees the financial dealings. Greg owns his own trucking company and hauls landscape materials for the Market Basket's landscape and garden centers.

The Edwardsville store retails a full line of

groceries, deli, landscaping and garden products. The other four stores provide a full line of landscaping and garden products with some available services.

The Godfrey store was established in 2001. Throughout the years, the family-owned operation helps Godfrey residents with products that enhance their lawns, gardens and outdoor living areas.

Be it plants, landscaping materials, bulk soils, rock and mulch, seeds, or trees, the Market Basket offers carry-out and delivery. They can even provide customers with custom planting of trees and container plants. All trees, shrubs, and roses have a one-year, 100% replacement only guarantee. They will offer a five-year guarantee, 1 time replacement on all trees and shrubs with purchase of MYKEs fertilizer

Customer must return the dead plant with original receipt. Only 1 replacement allowed. Annuals, perennials, hanging baskets and tropical plants do not have a guarantee. Guarantee does not apply to Landscape Contractors or Charge Account Customers.

Knowledgeable employees, who typically live in the individual stores' communities, are available to provide assistance to customers with questions. In the busy season each store will employ up to 15 individuals. In the off season, that employee level drops to two or three.

General manager, Andy Klos, said that Joe's Market Basket enjoys a great relationship with customers. He went on to say, "Customer service is one of our competitive advantages."

Because of the company's buying power

for all of its stores, it can offer competitive pricing comparable to the big box establishments.

Joe's Market Basket offers a "loyalty program." With that program customers can:

- · Earn dollar rewards
- Receive monthly email coupons and news
- Receive a seasonal newsletter and coupons

Here's How it Works

- Earn 1 point for every dollar you spend
- Earn 500 points within the promotional period and receive a \$20 Reward credit on your card
- Points will convert twice per year July 1st and November 1st

Each multiple of 500 points coverts to a \$20 credit. Points that did not convert will carry over and continue to accumulate for the next conversion date.
