

INVITATION FOR BIDS

Bids for the **2026 Concrete Pavement Replacement Project** in the Village of Godfrey, Illinois will be received by the Village Clerk until **10:00 AM WEDNESDAY, APRIL 1, 2026** at Godfrey Village Hall, 6810 Godfrey Road, Godfrey, Illinois 62035, and will thereafter be publicly read aloud.

The scope of work for this project involves the removal and replacement of concrete pavement on Chelsea Court, Mont Vista Avenue, and other related work as further described in the Project Manual.

Bid Documents will be available at the Village Clerk's office located at 6810 Godfrey Road, Godfrey, Illinois 62035. Prospective bidders may examine and obtain the bidding documents on weekdays between the hours of 7:30am-12:00pm and 1:00pm-4:30pm. A pre-bid meeting will not be held.

Each Bid must be accompanied by a cashier's check, a certified check, or a Bid Bond executed by the Bidder and an approved surety company, made payable to the Village of Godfrey, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the sum total of the bid.

Contractor shall not pay less than the prevailing rates of wages to all laborers, workmen, and mechanics performing work under this contract, and shall comply with the requirements of the Illinois Wages of Employees on Public Works Act (820 ILCS 130/1-12).

The Village reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive all informalities in Bids. By submitting Bid, Bidder agrees that their Bid will not be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days except as provided herein, subsequent to the specified time for receipt of Bids and further agrees to the terms and conditions of this invitation and the Project Manual regarding the bidding process. No low Bidder shall have a business expectancy merely because their Bid is the lowest one received: until the contract has been awarded, no business expectancy exists. Bids may be withdrawn solely for demonstrated and verifiable clerical or typographical mistake, but not mistake of judgment.
